


The Link Academy is fully subscribed for Year 7 in September 2021!

Easter Break COVID Tracking

If your child, who attended school between Monday 29th March 2021 and Friday 2nd April 2021, tests positive for Coronavirus (COVID-19) or develops symptoms within 2 days (48 hours) of being in school you should notify the academy by emailing (insert email) or telephoning (insert number if applicable) as soon as possible.

Where a learner or staff member tests positive for COVID-19 during the holiday, having developed symptoms more than 2 full days since being in school, the academy does not need to be contacted. Parents and carers and staff should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

Please remember that as soon as your child or any member of your household develops COVID-19 symptoms, they must start selfisolating immediately and book a test.

Important: LFD Home Testing over the **Easter Break**

It is recommend that all academy staff and learners continue to test themselves at home, twice weekly throughout the Easter holidays.

The Link Academy to be on Channel 4

Exciting news! Channel 4 has commissioned a new documentary series that will chart the lives of a group of young people from our very own The Link Academy. Triple P parenting programme

To strengthen parenting skills and support the parent/child relationship. We continue to work with our parents/carers and offer support by delivering Triple P sessions. This can be with telephone consultations, Microsoft TEAMS or online Triple P. We offer online groups to complete the Teen Group sessions in place of the face to face course. Dates for the sessions available 2021 will be confirmed on return to school in January.

What is Triple P?

The three Ps in 'Triple P' stand for 'Positive Parenting Programme'.

Triple P is a parenting programme that does not tell you what to do or how to be a parent. It is more like a toolbox of ideas, where you choose the strategies you need and the way you want to use them. It is all about making Triple P work for you.

How do you do Triple P?

You can do Triple P anywhere, anytime—24/7 with the online programmes. Triple P Online is for parents of toddlers to tweens (under 12 years), and Teen Triple P Online is for parents of pre-teens and teenagers (10-16 years). Additional telephone support can be provided with modules or strategies if parents require. Parents can complete Triple P online using mobiles or laptops, to access an online code go to:
