Dear Parent/Carer

We would like to inform you of an outbreak of COVID-19 at The Link Academy in 10BS.

Education and childcare settings are no longer required to conduct routine contact tracing. As with positive cases in any other setting, NHS Test and Trace will work with either the positive case – or in the case of children – the parents, carers or guardian of the positive case to identify close contacts.

However, due to the number of cases in 10BS, Dudley Council Public Health are advising your child arranges a PCR test, even if they do not have symptoms. This is to help identify any further transmission in this class. Your child will not be required to isolate, whilst waiting for their results, unless they are displaying symptoms. **Please note if your child has tested positive within the last 90 days do not get them tested, unless they have symptoms.**

To book a PCR test visit <https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test> and tick “I’ve been told to get a test by my local council, health protection team or healthcare professional” or call 119. Full guidance on how to book a PCR test online is attached to this letter.

Furthermore, households of nursery, school and college aged children are strongly encouraged to take part in twice-weekly lateral flow testing. This is because 1 in 3 people have coronavirus without displaying symptoms. If all families participate, it gives us the best chance of keeping our school safe and avoiding further transmission. ## What to do if your child develops symptoms of coronavirus (COVID 19)

If your child develops symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), they should isolate immediately and arrange a test via <https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test> or by calling 119. The rules on [self-isolation have changed](#).

Close contacts of a positive case (including households) no longer need to self-isolate if they are:

- o fully vaccinated
- o are under the age of 18 and 6 months
- o can't have the vaccination for medical reasons
- o or have taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial

**Any household members that are over 18 and 6 months and are not fully vaccinated will need to isolate.** The main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are a new, continuous cough, or a high temperature, or a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia).

In addition to the above main Covid-19 symptoms, if your child develops any of the following symptoms, it is also recommended they arrange a PCR test: *loss of appetite, sore throat, extreme tiredness, sneezing, headache, diarrhoea, joint or muscle ache, vomiting, nausea, rash, runny nose or congestion*. This is because these other symptoms have also been linked to Covid-19 infection. Individuals with any of these other symptoms (apart from diarrhoea and vomiting) **can carry on attending their setting** if they are well enough to do so. ### How to book a PCR test online if you do not have symptoms

1. Visit this website: <https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test> and choose 'Start now' near the bottom of the page
2. Select: "No" the person is not an essential worker

## Is the person who needs a test an essential worker?

Essential workers include NHS staff, teachers and transport staff. Check the [full list of essential workers on GOV.UK](#).

4. Select: "o, none of these symptoms"

### Does the person who needs a test have coronavirus symptoms?

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature
- new, continuous cough
- loss or change to your sense of smell or taste

Most people with coronavirus have at least one of these symptoms.

5. Select: "No" you have not been asked to get a follow-up test

### Has the person been asked to get a follow-up test?

For example, their first test was unclear or they need to confirm a possible positive result.

## Why are you asking for a test?

If you are getting a test for someone you live with, answer for them

- I've been in contact with someone who's tested positive for coronavirus
- I was asked to get a test because I visited a venue where others have since tested positive
- I've been told to get a test by my nursery, work or place of education
- I've been told to get a test by my local council, health protection team or healthcare professional
- My local council or health protection team has asked me to get a test, even though I do not have symptoms
- A GP or other healthcare professional has asked me to get a test
